Sentences in English have a very strict word order. Basic sentences in English follow the Subject (S), Verb (V), Object (O) pattern: S-V-O

The students

wanted

more pizza.

Object

My family and I

enjoy

skiing and other winter sports

Object

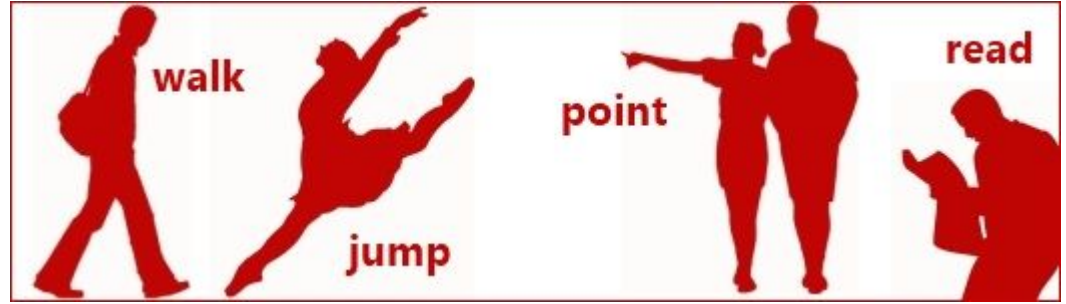
# 2 - Pronouns

Él----- He Ella-----She Eso-----It Usted -----Formal You	Ellos----- They Ellas
